Julia Hodson is the Chief Constable of Nottinghamshire Police. Ms Hodson joined the Merseyside Police in 1982 and spent time in Uniformed Policing, Personnel, Road Traffic, PSD and the Control Room.

Ms Hodson gained LLB Law Degree from Sheffield University in 1982. She continued further education at Lancaster University and received an MA in 'Crime Deviance and Social Policy'. Since then she has completed a Post Graduate Diploma in 'Counselling' from John Moore's University, Liverpool.

She transferred to Greater Manchester Police in June 1995 as a Superintendent working in the Development and Inspectorate Branch and Uniform Operations and as Commander at Wigan Division. She then moved to Lancashire Constabulary taking up the post of Assistant Chief Constable with responsibility for Human Resources and Training and subsequently became ACC Operations and then Acting Deputy Chief Constable.

Ms Hodson was appointed Deputy Chief Constable of West Yorkshire in 2004 and was appointed Acting Chief Constable in September 2006 following the retirement of Colin Cramphorn. She remained in this role until the arrival of Sir Norman Bettison as Chief Constable in January 2007. She was awarded the QPM in January 2008.
