DCC Davina Logan joined the Metropolitan Police in June 1976, transferring to Thames Valley in 1978.

Her career has been mainly operational, with two short interludes – one of two years as a Physical Training Instructor at Chantmarle District Training Centre in Dorset (now closed – but nothing to do with Davina!) – and the other of three years studying politics and sociology at Reading University, having been awarded a Bramshill Scholarship.

Davina's last two roles in Thames Valley were as Area Commander of a large rural area of South and West Oxfordshire and, latterly, as Head of Training, Education and Development.

She successfully passed the Strategic Command Course in September 2000 and was appointed Assistant Chief Constable (Support) in Leicestershire on 2nd January 2001. Davina moved to ACC (Operations) for 18mths before taking on the role of ACC (Crime) when the portfolios were re-adjusted.

In November 2004 Davina was appointed Deputy Chief Constable of Northamptonshire Police, and in 2006 was awarded the QPM.
