Jackie Roberts joined Dyfed-Powys Police on the 14th September, 2009, taking up the post of Deputy Chief Constable with responsibility for Human Resources, including Equality, Diversity and Human Rights; Operational HR; Employee Relations; Resourcing; Career Development/Succession Planning; Health, Safety and Wellbeing; Learning and Development Services; Talent Management; Coaching, Mentoring and PDR. In addition, she oversees the Force Legal Services Department, Professional Standards and Corporate Services, including Planning and Performance and Programme/Business Change Management.

Originally from South Wales, she joined her local police in 1983 and spent 22 years there before transferring to Avon and Somerset Constabulary in February 2005, as ACC, with responsibility for Crime and Criminal Justice issues across the force area.

In July 2008, Jackie took over responsibility for Crime, Operations and Protective Services, overseeing specialist response to major and serious incidents, working closely with partner agencies to plan, prepare and co-ordinate responses to a wide variety of major events, incidents and emergencies.

During her service she has worked in a variety of roles across Uniform and CID and is an accredited Senior Investigating Officer, Hostage Negotiator and Gold Commander for firearms and other major operational incidents.

Jackie has previously led the National Capabilities Group looking at the resource availability to respond to major incidents linked to terrorism and the Olympics and she also oversaw the response to and community consultation relating to the Ibrahim Terrorist Investigation in Bristol in 2008.

Nationally, Jackie leads the Street Level Up Programme with the Serious and Organised Crime Agency, aimed at tackling the drugs supply from street level through to importation routes. She has worked on developing national guidance for the Investigation of Domestic Abuse.

Her current role in Dyfed-Powys Police also involves leading the Change Programme in relation to delivering the austerity measures associated with the recent spending review announcements.

She is also Chair of the All Wales Management Board on Collaboration and the All Wales Equality and Diversity Group.

Jackie has a Degree in Police Studies and a Diploma in Criminology and Police Management.
