DAC Janet Williams joined the Metropolitan Police Service in 1982. She served in a number of detective roles up to and including detective inspector within North and Central London. She specialised in organised crime and sexual offences.

She held the post of Detective Chief Inspector and Senior Investigating Officer in the Anti-Terrorist Branch, was promoted in 1999 to Detective Superintendent and headed the Positive Action Team in response to the MacPherson Report.

In 2000 she was posted to Islington Borough as Superintendent in charge of operations where she raised performance, particularly around Kings Cross having a marked impact on the prolific drugs crime problems in that area.

In 2001 Janet was promoted to Borough Commander of Enfield, where she led her officers to a markedly enhance the performance of that Borough in key areas..

In November, 2003 she became Commander Special Branch, during one of the most critical periods of counter terrorism activity.

In 2006 she worked as Programme Manager on the Met Modernisation Programme before taking up her current role as Deputy Assistant Commissioner, Specialist Crime Directorate dealing with, Homicide, Kidnap, Child Abuse, Covert Policing, Corporate Intelligence, Corporate Tasking, Fraud, Drugs, Shootings and Operation Trident.

She holds an Honours degree in History from York University and a Post Graduate degree in Criminology from the London School of Economics.
